So I have some news... in case you haven't heard already. I'm being appointed to a new role at St Faith's church in Maidstone. Essentially this means that my final service in the current role will be on the 29 September at St Nicholas Church, Leeds at 10am.

This is a bittersweet appointment for us as a family, on the one hand we're really excited to see what God will be doing with us in the new role but on the other hand we're bitterly disappointed to be leaving our current churches. Perhaps the hardest part will be to leave all the good people we have met and come to love. From day one we were welcomed, valued and encouraged and we genuinely couldn't be more thankful. But in truth we leave full of optimism for ourselves and the North Downs Churches.

It's been a real joy for me to be part of the community in Leeds, Broomfield and Kingswood, and I've gotten to know some wonderfully gifted people across the villages and churches. It's partly for this reason that, despite our departure, I'm incredibly hopeful for the churches moving forward.

The Christian faith always offers new beginnings. Every time we fall short we come to God in confession and we trust in his grace and mercy, that we have been forgiven and we start again. A bit like when Peter takes his eyes off Jesus when walking on water, he cries out to be saved and Jesus immediately takes his hand and returns him to the boat.

I truly believe there are even brighter days ahead for the churches and maybe the future of all depends on the people's willingness to

step out of the boat at times, to show faith, to be brave. Our willingness to do this so often depends on our continued falling in love with Jesus. We do this through prayer and exploring scripture, keeping our eyes set firmly on him and growing in the knowledge of His love for us!

The beauty of Luke's account of Peter walking on water is that he wasn't rebuked for messing it up... Jesus said 'you of little faith, why did you doubt?' in other words why did you stop looking to me? The disciples' response was to worship... redirecting their gaze to Jesus! It's why we meet together regularly in the churches to worship.

I guess for all of us there are question marks over our futures, but please know this...

We will miss Leeds, Broomfield and Kingswood greatly because we love the people ... but not as much as God does!!! So keep your eyes fixed on him and trust him with your new beginnings.

We're so grateful to have been welcomed into your community and we continue to pray for you all of you.

LEEDS M CASTLE

Well, we finally seem to be in proper summer as I write, with consistently beautiful weather every day. In the gardens, there is still lots of stunning colour, while the Hollyhocks have now gone over for the year, the roses are still lovely and there are lots of beautiful dahlias in full flower.

The beautiful wild flower meadow continues to flower and should do so well into Autumn. It has been great to see so many visitors enjoying walking the mown paths through it and taking pictures with the Castle in the background during the summer.

It is a very busy time of year at the Castle, with lots of happy visitors enjoying the estate. If you get a chance to bring children or grand-children, they will definitely enjoy the beautiful *Secret Lives of Woodland Animals Trail*, featuring intricate (imagined) miniature homes of the wildlife that lives on site. There are also performers each weekend to bring the stories to life.

We held another successful *Leeds Castle Concert* in mid-July, featuring an ABBA Tribute Band as well as John Rigby and the fabulous Royal Philharmonic Orchestra. It was unfortunate that there was a huge downpour during the ABBA Tribute, with lots of concert-goers getting absolutely soaked. But, many danced on through the rain and a great time was had by all.

We just finished a weekend of *Motors by the Moat,* this popular event returning for the first time since 2019. It was stunning weather and a lovely atmosphere as thousands enjoyed the spectacular car stunts on Main Drive and jet ski display on the Moat. It was great to see so many happy people enjoying the vintage and super cars on display, & enjoying themselves in the sun.

From 26 August, we move into a brand-new Sublime Sculpture Trail, running until 6 October and included in the 12-month admission ticket.

Looking ahead to Autumn and Winter, we have daytime *Hallowe'en* & Christmas experiences. During October Half-Term, children are invited to become Spell Seekers and interact with six magical beings around the Estate, before joining the Hallowe'en Ball and Fancy Dress competition.

From 23 November to 31 December, the Castle will be transformed into scenes from *The Nutcracker*, with live performers at weekends and during the school Christmas holidays. Many of you will have enjoyed Narnia in the Castle last year, so we hope you will join us for this magical experience too. Both *Hallowe'en* and *The Nutcracker* are included in your 12-month ticket.

We will also have a bookable Nutcracker themed Afternoon Tea (adults &children).

In the evening, separately ticketed events, sales are now underway for both Christmas Lights and Fireworks Spectacular. 80% of Christmas Lights installations are new for this year, so we hope you will come along to this stunning festive show, with great catering, marshmallow toasting and fairground rides. This year, we will also have a Big Wheel which will give exceptional views over the Castle from height!

In July, our new caterers refurbished the Castle View Restaurant and Stable Café and introduced new menus. We now also have a stunning cocktail bar which serves small plates of delicious squid bites, charcuterie and other tempting fare, so come down to try it out!

Update from Helen Whately your local MP



Thank you to everyone who voted for me in July. It is the honour of my life serving as Faversham and Mid Kent's MP and I am so proud to be re-elected.

That said, It was a tough general election campaign. Many of you told me about your frustrations with the Conservatives - the message was loud and clear. Whether you voted for me or not, I am here for you if you need my help.

I know that people across the country voted for change, and I respect their decision. I will not oppose the Labour Government for the sake of it. That said, if they propose legislation that is not in the interests of the country or local people, I will fight our corner.

The Government has already made decisions that were not in their manifesto with announcements to slash transport infrastructure investment, ditch social care reforms, means test winter fuel payments and put the country on notice for tax rises.

On top of these announcements the Government's new planning reforms will totally change the look and feel of Kent. They will reverse all <u>my hard work</u> in persuading the last Government to drop mandatory housing targets and focus on higher density in urban areas.

Instead, they will stop communities from having a meaningful say in the planning process and will reinstate housing targets for councils - while also cutting London's housing targets from 100,000 to 80,000

This is a slap in the face for Kent. Labour have chosen to prioritise building on our green fields over brownfield sites in London. It is the wrong choice, and will result in hundreds more new houses here, over and above current plans

I am also heartbroken that Labour has chosen to abandon the cap on social care costs. After years of political disagreement about social care, we had at last achieved a consensus - this was in both the Labour and Conservative manifestos. This will mean higher care costs for people who need it.

The Government have also announced scrapping the extra cash for training care

workers. This will force social care to continue to rely on low paid staff and will inevitably result in people paying more for a reduced service. It will also continue our reliance on workers from oversees which is another backward step.

And I have already been inundated with people contacting me who are worried sick about Labour's choice to means test Winter Fuel Payments. This means that pensioners not receiving pension credits or other means-tested benefits will no longer get up to £300 to help with the cost of heating their homes.

This will leave many older people who are just about managing to have to choose between heating and eating this winter. I am advising people who contact me about Winter Fuel Payments to double check to see if they are entitled to Pension Credits, and to sign up for them if they are.

This policy is particularly shocking when we remember that just over 2 months ago in PMQs, Keir Starmer asked Rishi Sunak about the Conservative Government cutting Winter Fuel Payments!

After the Chancellor the Prime Minister and Cabinet said over 50 times that they would not increase taxes they have put the country on notice for future tax hikes. We will know in the Autumn whether they will tax our homes, pension or income.

It's clearly going to be a tough few years for us with this Government but I will keep my <u>election promises</u> and fight for Faversham and Mid Kent every step of the way.
