The previous Sunday, at Kingswood Church, Mark was presented with his favourite biscuits, chocolate and cards, in the shape of doughnuts, by the children.

We remember with thanks the on-line Sunday services, taken by Mark, Tansye and the girls every week, during those long months of isolation with Covid19, where the worship, bible teaching and prayers kept us renewed in mind, body and spirit. Many can testify to coming to faith, others to a renewal and strenghening of their faith, through Mark's ministry in our churches, schools, care homes and communities. 

LEEDS X CASTLE

It has been great to have an extended period of good weather recently, enabling lots of people to enjoy the stunning autumn colours across the estate. October Half Term was very well attended, with lots of families enjoying the Guardians of the Grounds trail and the performers who were bringing the story to life.

We were equally pleased to have good weather for the Fireworks Spectacular that took place last weekend. It was the usual high standard of fireworks, with the theme of Colours this year. At one point there was a giant multicoloured chameleon projected onto the Castle, to the tune of Karma Chameleon. Much fun had by all.

It is the season for clearing undergrowth and preparing the garden for the winter, along with widespread new bulb planting. Our new Gardens and Grounds Manager, John Myers, is driving a major investment in spring bulbs, meaning we should have a stunning spring flower display for 2025. Much more to come in gardens development!

We have now completed repair works on the Pavilion, which has stood empty for some time. In Lady Baillie's time, this lovely building was used for afternoon tea while people played tennis on the Pavilion Lawn. We were delighted to have the support of PAYE Stonework, who are our partner in the long-term project to repair the stone work on the Castle. They donated the labour of six workmen to restore the Pavilion as part of their contribution to the local community.

We now have a stunning restored space, which will be available for the use of the community groups we are partnering with. PAYE also partnered with us to run some schools' workshops in September for students from local secondary schools to learn about heritage conservation skills & careers.

Over the summer we worked with a number of local community groups on a trial basis to evaluate how we could work with these groups to bring people to Leeds Castle, who have barriers to access. These might be due to cost, disability or confidence.

We worked with Kent Young Carers charities, Imago & Crossroads and 21 Together, a local charity that supports families with children with Downs' Syndrome to host visits and learn more about how we can make them more welcome on site. We hope to expand this programme gradually over the next year.

From 23 November to 31 December, the Castle will be transformed into magical scenes from *The Nutcracker*, with live performers at weekends and during the school Christmas holidays. Both *Hallow-e'en* and *The Nutcracker* are included in your 12-month ticket and you can get a flavour of the experience from videos now on website.

The special themed *Nutcracker* Afternoon Tea (adults & children) is looking stunning (and having tried the cakes, I can confirm they are absolutely delicious). This needs to be pre-booked on our website or by calling Castle View Restaurant.

Christmas Lights Trail is returning from 22 November, with 80% new installations, great catering, marshmallow toasting and fairground rides, including a Big Wheel giving great views over the Castle!

The Castle will be donating Christmas Trees to local schools and churches as usual, so I hope that you enjoy these as you go around your Christmas preparations!

Minutes of Previous Meeting

Agreed & signed as a true record. Declaration of Interests : None declared.

Public Participation

No members of the public attended.

Highways Matters

Leak at the bottom of Foley Hill still ongoing. Clerk has yet to receive a response from South and South East Water.

The hatch lines by The George have been repainted.

KCC appear to have acknowledged the request to refill/renew the salt bins. If you have concerns about pot holes and empty/damaged grit bins please either use the KCC website or advise the Parish Clerk.

Chairman's Report

I met up with our MP Helen Whately at Lenham Village Hall with numerous other Parish Councillors and raised the Haven Farm development in Sutton Valance. this where the developer has agreed to finance a road change on the Headcorn road by The Plough whereby traffic will be encouraged to turn into the B2163 when heading towards Maidstone to go North towards the M20 as opposed to using Willington St. This would be a totally retrograde step putting more vehicles onto a overloaded B road and must be disregarded. whist Helen agreed it was outside of her area but she would take it up with KCC and MBC councillor Gary Cooke. Other topics raised, by other Parish Councillors were Operation Brock on the M20 and anti social behaviour.

Financial Matters

The financial statement & payments were approved and made.

Report from KCC Councillor

Cllr Cooke advised that there were now five community wardens two of which dedicated to the south east of the borough.

MBC were pursuing a new local plan which would raise a new call for sites.

he also offered to attend a meeting with the school to discuss the parking issues. *Report from MBC Councillor*

Cll Fort advised that she would, on behalf of the Leeds Parish Council, discuss and strongly object to the road change proposed by the developer involved with the Haven Farm Development in Sutton Valance with the planning team at Maidstone. This a matter now of extreme urgency as the closing date for any objections is later in the month. The proposal is to change the road layout by the Plough Public House to encourage traffic heading towards Maidstone from Sutton Valance needing to turn north to turn into the Leeds/Langley road rather than use Willington St!

Parish Maintenance

Response received from Leeds Castle re a contribution to the cost of hedge pruning around the Church graveyard. The Castle unable to contribute as they have only a small team of contractors now. It was decided to review the hedge cutting in the new year.

Leaves on the pavement through the village and in the tennis courts giving concern, contractor to be asked to remove.

Leeds Playground, Playing Field, Tennis Courts & Pavilion

Insurance inspection of the children's play area highlighted that a wooden cap on one of the gate posts was missing. Cll China to get local handyman to replace. Report that tennis courts are being used by dog walkers and complaint from resident that drug taking being carried out. It was decided that the tennis courts would be locked and if entry required residents to contact the Parish Clerk. Clr Gary Cooke is to take up the drug problem with the community police team.

Street Lighting

With the nights drawing in it is important that all the street lights are working. If you spot any that are not please contact the Clerk.

The new bollard light on the path through the Church grounds has been replaced and the studs cut down.

A Christmas update from your local MP

One moment it was summer, and the next, a November mist settles over the fields, and here I am writing for the Leeds and Broomfield Christmas Special. Where did the time go?

Talking of fields, many of you have contacted me concerned about building on fields especially the best 'Grade 1' farmland. This top quality land is scarce – only about 3% of the UK's farmland – and it's important for food production. We are lucky to have a swathe of it here in Kent.

That's why I recently introduced a Private Members Bill in Parliament seeking to stop so-called Garden Villages being built on Grade 1 land. As a 'PMB' its path to get onto the statute book is a difficult one. And it can't stop developments that have already received planning permission. But I will do what I can to protect the farmland we need to feed future generations.


The budget was also challenging for food production. The increase in the minimum wage is good for workers on low pay, but together with national insurance it's a big rise in costs for farmers, especially local fruit growers who need a large workforce. And then there's the changes to 'Agricultural Property Relief' and 'Business Property Relief' which have drastic consequences for family businesses. I've been meeting some of those affected locally. If you are caught by these changes and would like to attend a future meeting, please let me know.

Against all of that, there was some good news to welcome in the budget – like continued investment in high-speed broadband and extra funding for pothole repairs. The road maintenance money is not enough, given the state of our roads and volume of traffic, but it's something. I'll keep lobbying for a larger budget and a solution to Operation Brock, which puts so much traffic onto our roads whenever it's activated.

I count as a success the delay of the EU's new 'Entry Exit System' (EES), which was set to launch in November. When I visited Dover in the summer it was clear that the technology wasn't ready – a point I made robustly to the EU's Deputy Ambassador a few weeks ago. Thankfully they postponed the launch. But I'm still concerned that when it comes we'll get queues at Dover and Operation Brock again, so I'll keep a close eye on this.

Until then, if I can help in any way, please reach out. I would also like to pass on my thanks to all of those who organise the many festivities across Leeds and Broomfield over the Christmas period. I wish you all a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!
