A happy, prosperous New Year to you all!

The scout group had a stall at the Kingswood fete in the summer, we had Play Your Cards Right, open the box (find the right key) and a firing range, all the children and adults enjoyed it.

We had our Autumn quiz, this was very well attended and was enjoyed by all. I thank Carol and Steve who arranged the questions and were our callers.

The group for Remembrance Day, went to the Tommy in the morning at the cross roads for the 2 minute silence and later in the afternoon we had the service in Broomfield Church. The group made poppies and laid them on the edge of the path up to the church entrance.

All the committee on the group have now been changed to trusties. We have started putting planters out side the scout hut.

SCOUTS

There are 17 scouts and 6 leaders/volunteers. They had a busy term, they presented 142 badges, well done to them.

LEEDS CASTLE

As I write, we are two weeks out from Christmas Day, but by the time you read this, the Christmas period will be over for another year. I hope that many of you enjoyed visiting the Christmas Lights and the Nutcracker in the Castle Experience over the Christmas period and perhaps even enjoyed a Nutcracker Afternoon Tea as my family did!

It has been lovely seeing the positive reactions to the Christmas Trees that the Castle donates annually to local schools & churches. They have all been decorated in a beautiful fashion and were a joy to see. Lots of schools have been enjoying our Nutcracker Christmas Experience during December too.

It has been something of an eventful time during our Christmas events, with two weekends of appalling weather and severe gales, meaning we had to close the Christmas Lights Trail and day time visiting for two weekends. As a heavily wooded site, we take high winds very seriously, as branches and entire trees can fall in high winds.

While we clearly don't want to disappoint visitors, especially at Christmas, safety is always paramount and there will be times when we have to close the site due to high winds. We use the Met Office forecasts and on site anenometers to make decisions.

We have two stages of closure; the first is when we close the Woodland Garden and bring guests in through the Main Drive. The second is when we have to close the site completely to guests due to high wind forecasts.

For the duration of Yellow, Amber or Red weather warnings, we do not recommend use of public footpaths near wooded areas to ensure your safety.

Focus now turns to 2025 activity. Soon the snowdrops will be starting to appear, followed by crocuses, daffodils and tulips. We have planted a vast number of tulips this year, so expect the spring show to be especially lovely. The Wild Flower Meadow will be in its second year in summer, bigger and better for 2025.

We have lots of conservation work underway in January, with plaster repairs to the Gatehouse, electrical distribution board upgrades and essential building repairs in the Maiden's Tower, as well as works to refurbish the Moat Sluices, controlling water flow.

Stone repairs were completed to the Moat Bridge during December, using divers and a water-resistant mortar. We have also completed repairs to the Bell Tower and will be starting repairs to the East Terrace in January.

Intensive work is also underway on our new exhibition, focussing on Queen Eleanor of Castile's fascinating life. Queen of King Edward I, Eleanor owned Leeds Castle as part of her personal property portfolio and built the Gloriette in 1278, the oldest part of the Castle on the second island in the Moat. Married at the age of 12, Eleanor made a huge impact on the culture of England, bringing Castilian design, art and literature with her. The exhibition will tell the story of her life, through artistic and digital installations and should open in June 2025.

An update from your local MP Helen Whately

Happy New Year to everyone. As we put the challenges of 2024 behind us I hope with all my heart 2025 will be a better year. It's also a milestone for me, as 7th May is the 10th anniversary as the MP for Faversham and Mid Kent. It continues to be the honour of my life to serve you and represent you in Parliament.

It's been an extraordinary ten years. Brexit, the pandemic, war in Ukraine, inflation, migration, climate change, terrorism, online safety, the struggles of the NHS, the housing shortage, the building over our countryside. There has been so much to grapple with, and that's just a list of things that came to mind.

People sometimes ask me what I am most proud of achieving, as an MP. That makes me think, because being an MP is mostly about lots of contributions you make every day, arguing for this area, trying to make things better across the country, and helping people out. Being a health minister during the pandemic was the hardest time but also the time when every day made a difference. Locally I've worked particularly hard on health, including helping get us the Kent Medical School so we will have more local doctors.

As I write this, we are approaching Small Business Saturday, which is a moment to celebrate small businesses and all they do for our community. This year I'm visiting businesses in and around Bearsted. But wherever you live, do please remember to support your local shops, pubs, cafes, tea shops, or whatever you have nearby. Most businesses do much more for the community than whatever it says on their sign.

It's also looking like a tough time ahead for many of those businesses along with local farmers and GPs, after the tax rises in the budget. I've been meeting many of those affected and have written to the Chancellor. Please get in touch with me if you would like me to know about your situation.

As I write another big local concern is the Deputy Prime Minister's decision to 'call in' the Highsted Park development and decide whether it goes ahead, rather than leave it to Swale Borough Council. It's unusual for a minister to step in like this, and odd that the news came moments before local councillors were due to make their own decision. I've written to her to find out what's going on.

I'll keep you up updated on progress with this, not only because it affects lots of people but also because if this becomes a trend, it'll have serious consequences across the constituency

St Nicholas, Leeds & St Margaret's, Broomfield – Electoral Roll

The Church of England Parish Electoral Roll is revised every year, but every six years a new electoral roll has to be drawn up. The next occasion is 2025, so we will be doing this in preparation for the next Parochial Church Council (PCC) AGM in April 2025. As St Nicholas and St Margaret's are two churches in a single parish with a joint PCC, there will be a single Electoral Roll to cover both.

You may already be on the current Electoral Roll, or perhaps you are not aware you could be on it. As the 2025 Electoral Roll will be a new one, everybody who would like to be on it needs to make an application.

What is the Electoral Roll?

In the same way that being on the civic electoral roll allows you to vote in parliamentary and local elections, joining the Church Electoral Roll means that you can vote on Church matters, attend the Annual Parochial Church Meeting and stand for election to the PCC (although you do not have to do any of these).

There is no cost to being on the Electoral Roll. It also does not make you a "member" of the Church; simply regarding St Nicholas or St Margaret's as your spiritual home does that.

Do I qualify for the Roll?

- ♦ To apply for the Electoral Roll you must meet the following conditions:
- ◆ You must be aged 16 or over (though you can apply in the year you become 16 and your name will be entered once your birth date has passed).
- ♦ You must be baptised.
- You must be able to declare one of the following:
- ◆ That you are a member of the Church of England, or of a Church in communion with it, and live in the parish; or

- You are a member of the Church of England or of a Church in communion with it, do not live in the parish, but have habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months; or
- ♦ That you are a member in good standing of a Church which is not in communion with the Church of England but subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and is also a member of the Church of England and have habitually attended public worship in the parish during the preceding six months.
- ◆ Can I be on more than one Electoral Roll?
- Yes you can. The only restriction is that you can serve on the PCC of only one parish.
- ♦ How do I apply to be on the 2025 Electoral Roll?
- Notices have been posted in both churches giving full information including the deadline for applications, which is 21 March 2025. There are application forms available near the church entrances (including by the south door at St Nicholas, which is open during the daytime most days).

You can also contact the Electoral Roll Officer to ask for an application to be sent to you by post or email. Please contact Judie Sweatman at church services, or on judie17@europe.com (please put Electoral Roll in the subject line), or leave her a note asking for a form at St Nicholas church.
