Favourite Bible Stories

Do you have a favourite bible story? Maybe Noah's Ark or Daniel and Goliath or Jonah and the whale from the Old Testament or possibly The Good Samaritan or Jesus feeding the 5,000 in the New Testament.

My favourite is in Luke's gospel and is called the walk to Emmaus. The story is of two of Jesus' followers walking from Jerusalem to a village called Emmaus, a distance similar to that from Leeds, Broomfield and Kingswood (LBK) to Maidstone. We know that one was called Cleopas but we don't know the name of the other. Maybe they were two friends or, as some have suggested, were they were husband and wife? They were talking about the crucifixion, death and burial of Jesus and understandably they were very confused and sad.

A man comes and walks beside them and starts to ask them questions about the topic of their conversation. For some reason, as they explain what had happened, they did not recognise who he was. When they had reached their destination, they ask the man to stay with them as it was getting late in the evening.

They have a meal together and when 'he took bread, gave thanks, broke it and began to give it to them, their eyes were opened and they recognised him' as the risen Lord Jesus, 'and he disappeared from their sight.' I wonder how often do we recognise the presence of the Lord Jesus in others or as we partake of Communion and the breaking of bread? I also wonder how often do we not recognise the presence of the Lord Jesus Christ with us. Perhaps at times of confusion, bereavement or sadness, like our two friends in the story.

In such times of hardship and difficulty it's good to remember that nothing can separate us from the love of God. Paul writes in Romans, 'For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor any-

thing else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.' To that list we might add war.

On 8 May is the 80th Anniversary of VE Day (Victory in Europe Day) marking 80 years since the end of the Second World War where, as the British Legion says, we give thanks for the 'men and women who defended the freedoms we enjoy today. We remember their service and sacrifice.'

This year also marks the 80th anniversary of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a German Lutheran pastor who was executed on 9 April 1945, for opposing the Nazis, just weeks before the end of World War II. At his execution his last words were, 'This is the end – for me, the beginning of life' showing his belief in the resurrection of Christ.

As we remember those who gave their lives, below is a prayer for peace from the Church of England Service for VE Day:

O Lord our God, as we remember, teach us the ways of peace. As we treasure memories, teach us to hope. As we give thanks for the sacrifices of the past, help us to make your future in this world, until your kingdom come. **Amen.**

But what about Cleopas and his friend, what happened to them? They went back to Jerusalem to tell the disciples all that had happened only to find that they also had seen the risen Lord. Halleluiah! May we too experience the risen Lord Jesus Christ, and the presence of God, in our daily lives through, among other things, prayer, reading the bible, having fellowship and the breaking of bread.

40th North Downs Walk – 8 June 2025

LEEDS X CASTLE

Hoping that everyone has been enjoying the glorious weather over the past month. It has been a joy to see the reams of beautiful daffodils and tulips out across the estate and the hellebores are also looking lovely. Our Gardens and Grounds Manager is planning a large amount of replanting in the gardens, to refresh old stock, so you should see a fabulous display over the spring and summer. It also won't be long until the Wild Flower Meadow in front of the Castle will be back in bloom.

We hosted a National Lottery Heritage Fund free entry for the day with a lottery ticket on 15 March, welcoming over 4,500 visitors & launching the lovely refurbished Pavilion as a pre-loved bookshop. This is now a gorgeous, relaxing space, filled with sofas, chairs & bookshelves. Any book donations gratefully received, with profits going towards conserving our heritage assets for future generations.

We did this in recognition of £300,000 in grants received over past year, including monies to purchase Lady Baillie's Secretaire (Writing Desk), an original hand-painted piece designed by Stephane Boudin for the Castle in the 1930's. The Secretaire left the collection in the 1970's, but has now been reunited with the Castle and is on display in Lady Baillie's Boudoir.

We are currently in the middle of the Easter holidays and running a popular Horrible Histories Knights Trail, where children can become knights and choose four items to create their own Knight's Crest in the Shield Making Tent. There is also the opportunity to practice knightly sword skills at the Training Ground, with live performers bringing knightly approach to life throughout the Easter holidays. On successful completion of the trail, a chocolate coin is awarded.

The Horrible Histories theme will continue into May Half Term,

when we will be hosting the Queens Joust over Bank Holiday Weekend of 24/25/26 May. A new Horrible Histories trail will run over the whole May Half Term Week themed around Queen Eleanor of Castile, who built the first part of the Castle, the Gloriette, in 1278. The trail will revolve around Poisons and Potion Making and should be great fun.

Two years ago, we introduced a new Multimedia Guide in the Castle, which is available free as part of your annual ticket. This contains a '900 Years of History' tour, covering all the key Castle events since 1278. In early June, we will be launching an additional tour option, 'Invitation to Decadence', which tells a gossipy story through the eyes of two guests at one of Lady Baillie's 1930's Country House Weekends, as well as involving some of the Below Stairs staff.

The eagle-eyed amongst you will have noticed that we were granted planning permission in January to replace the long-term Glamping tents (located on the field adjoining Broomfield Road) with yearround lodges. Medieval themed, these Knights' Retreat Lodges sleep between 4-5 people, with a small kitchenette and their own bathrooms. Two of Lodges are fully accessible, providing excellent accommodation for people with a disability. Guests enter through main delivery entrance Broomfield Gate.

Groundworks and infrastructure connections are underway at the moment, with the Lodges in manufacture, first Lodges should arrive in late April. We hope to launch this accommodation offer to the market just in time for school summer holidays, which will provide a fantastic new entry-level offer for guests, who will undoubtedly spend money in the wider local economy too.
